# CMS Emergency Preparedness Final Rule

- Timeline
  - Finalized September 8, 2016
  - Published in the *Federal Register* on September 16, 2016
  - Effective November 15, 2016
  - Implement November 15, 2017
  - Interpretive guidelines and survey procedures anticipated spring 2017

# HPP Funding Timeline

- Currently in budget period five of a five-year project period (FY 2012 – FY 2016)
- Current focus: Assessment and strategic planning for new five-year project period
- July 1, 2017, begins a new five-year project period
  - New capabilities published
  - Performance measures and funding levels expected January 2017

# New Healthcare Preparedness and Response Capabilities

- Foundation for Health Care and Medical Readiness
  - HCCs, HVAs, plans, regulatory compliance
- Health Care and Medical Response Coordination
  - Information sharing and coordination platforms
- Continuity of Health Care Service Delivery
  - COOP, responder safety and health, evacuation and relocation
- Medical Surge
  - Special populations, alternate care sites, medical countermeasures, fatalities

# Healthcare Coalition MOU

- Statewide memorandum of understanding currently in final review to be released in early 2017
- Purpose: To formalize, track and provide documentation to HCC members and partners
  - CMS Conditions of Participation
  - HCC exercise requirements

# CDC's Tiered Response Framework

- Frontline Facilities
  - All hospitals/providers capable of screening, isolating and protecting staff, patients and visitors
- Assessment Hospitals
  - Barnes Jewish Hospital selected through the DHSS competitive procurement process
- Treatment Centers (nationally-designated)
  - HHS Region VII: Nebraska Medicine - Nebraska Medical Center, Omaha, Nebraska



# Ebola Supplemental Funding

- Hospital Preparedness Program Components
  - Assessment hospital: Barnes Jewish Hospital
  - Healthcare Coalitions
    - Plan alignment, PPE training, regional equipment caches (MARC, STARRS, MHA)
    - Transport agencies:
      - None identified through DHSS contractual process
      - HPP currently aligning with EMS mutual aid coordinators to develop statewide transportation plan
  - Vendor-managed inventory purchase to be executed in early 2017
    - VMI to include appropriate quantities of PPE for treatment of highly infectious patients, to **exclude** respiratory protection

# April 2017 Ebola Exercise

- Statewide education and training offering to be held in St. Louis
  - National Ebola Training and Education Center (NETEC) technical assistance visit
  - HCC tabletop exercise (all seven HCCs)
  - Assessment hospital full scale exercise
- More information will be provided to HCC leadership as the exercise is developed.

# Annual Hospital Capacity Assessment

- Scheduled to be disseminated mid-December
- Broader focus to include select safety and quality-related topics that align with preparedness initiatives.
- MHA to host an informational webinar following the release of the assessment.

# Emergency Preparedness



Every year in the United States, disasters occur of the severity and magnitude that state and federal authorities issue disaster declarations. The vast majority of these emergency declarations are caused by severe weather. Flooding, ice and snow, tornadoes, hurricanes and earthquakes have been and continue to be the hazards and risks likely to require a

community-based emergency response. However, domestic and international acts of terrorism are a reality for our nation, and individual acts of violence occur in every community. Consider the increasing number of active shooters in schools, hospitals and workplace settings. In nearly every incident, hospitals are a critical component of the response.

Building capacity and capability to prepare for and respond to incidents that stress normal hospital daily operations is essential. Further, the collaboration and coordination among government, public health, long-term care, clinics and hospitals must occur to ensure coordinated plans and response during an incident. MHA is committed to providing leadership and expertise to support hospital preparedness and response.
