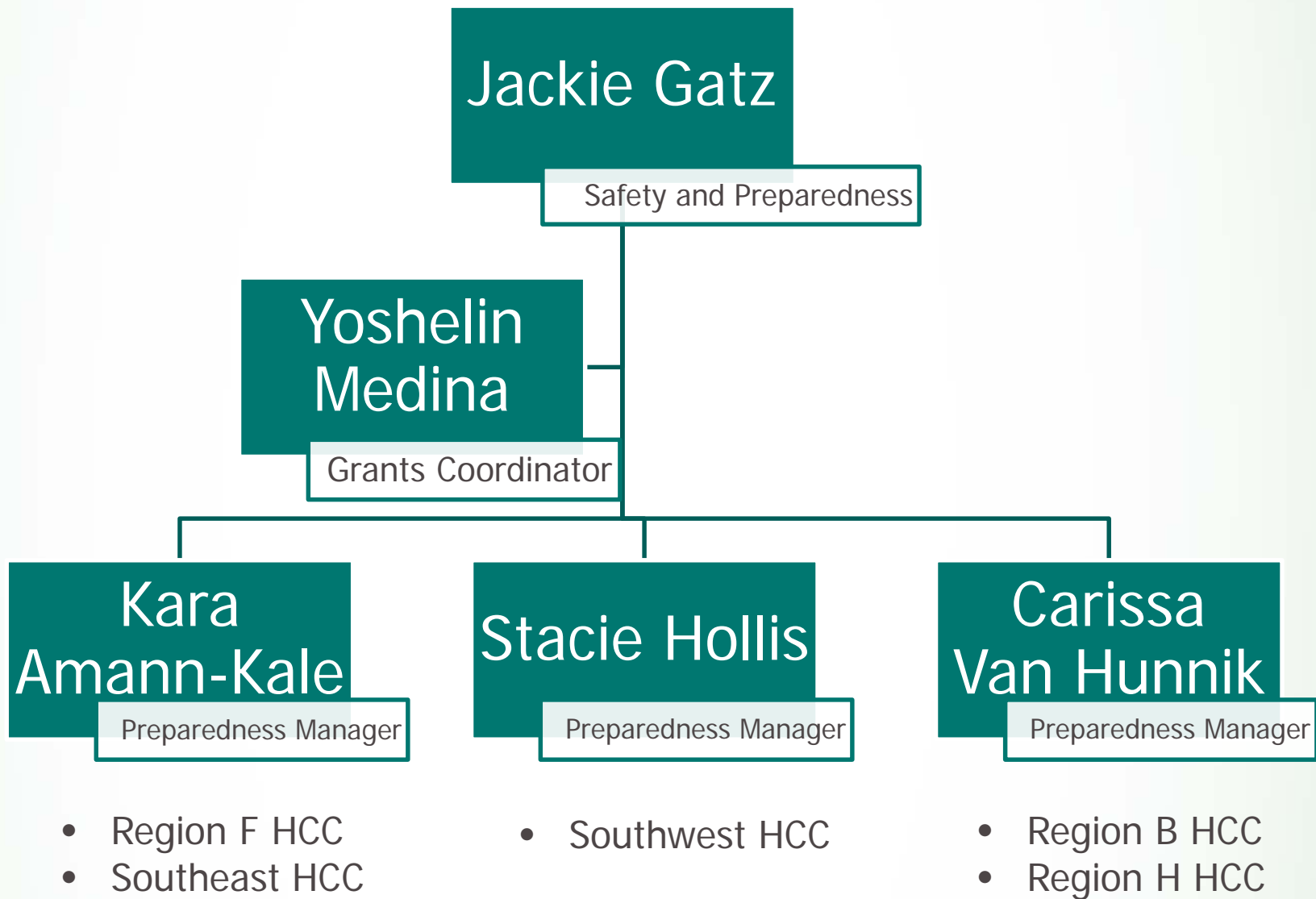

Hospital Preparedness Program Update

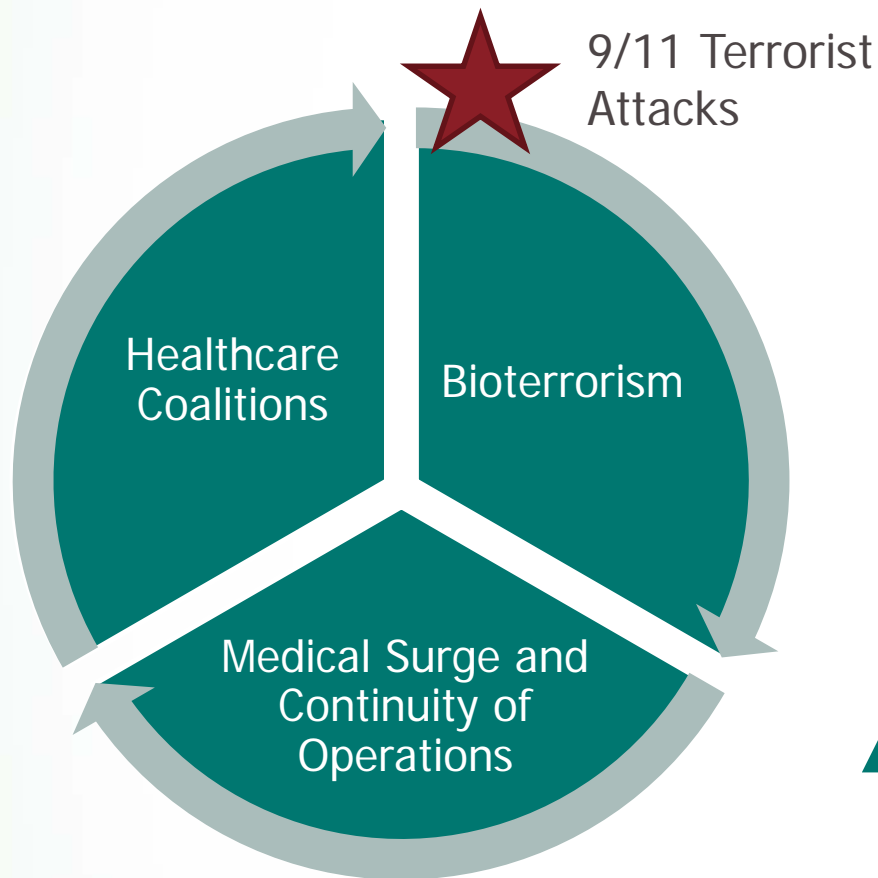
FY18 HPP Funding Cycle

- July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019
 - 2nd of a 5 year project period (2017-2021)
 - Missouri: \$3,719,273; National: \$224,948,000
- Pandemic and All-hazards Preparedness and Advancing Innovation Act of 2018
 - Authorized federal funding to drive the National Health Security Strategy – HPP, PHEP, BARDA, FDA, etc.
 - Must be signed into law by September 30, 2018
 - Anticipate a new project period beginning July 1, 2019

Additional HHS ASPR Funding Opportunity Announcement

- Vision of ASPR Secretary Robert Kadlec
- Call for demonstration sites for implementation of the Regional Disaster Health Response System – applications were due August 15
 - Centers of Disaster Excellence
 - Clinical Focus
- While **Missouri did not submit an application**, we are strategically reviewing the FOA as we develop our ongoing initiatives.

CMS Emergency Preparedness Final Rule

- Implemented November 15, 2017
- Regulations intended to establish:
 - “A comprehensive, consistent, flexible, and dynamic regulatory approach to EP and response that incorporates the lessons learned from the past, combined with the proven best practices of the present.”

Monitoring Flu Impact on Missouri Hospitals



Strategy Development

- Recognized challenges with 2017-2018 flu monitoring activities
 - Reactive, despite anticipated surge
 - Burdensome queries
 - Less efficient data compilation and distribution
- MHA prioritized the refinement of this strategy, engaging hospital preparedness leadership and the EMResource Advisory Committee to validate approach.

What You Need To Know

- 2018-2019 flu monitoring strategy awaiting review and feedback by HCC leadership
- EMResource Advisory Committee to review metrics and collection platform on September 13
- Final approvals at DHSS Statewide HCC Leadership Partnership on September 20
- Memo to hospital emergency preparedness, infection prevention and chief executives during the last week of September
- Baseline monitoring to begin no later than Oct. 4

Statewide Flu Monitoring Queries

Phase I

Baseline, once per week

- Begins at the start of each new flu season

Phase II

Increased monitoring, once per week

- Triggered by one or more regions reporting flu related concerns

Phase III

Increased monitoring, twice per week

- Triggers TBD

CDC's Tiered Response Framework

- Frontline Facilities
 - All hospitals/providers capable of screening, isolating and protecting staff, patients and visitors
- Assessment Hospitals
 - Barnes-Jewish Hospital selected through the DHSS competitive procurement process
- Treatment Centers (nationally-designated)
 - HHS Region VII: Nebraska Medicine - Nebraska Medical Center, Omaha, Nebraska

2018 Actions – Ebola Supplemental Funding

- HCCs conducted spring 2018 TTX exercise
- Education under development for frontline facilities on statewide plan, to include transport
- Refine and test eICS notification procedures and recipients
- Prepare for Spring 2019 Region VII full scale exercise – May 29-30, 2019
 - Testing staff protection and safe handling of patients under investigation within each HCC
 - Simulating the transport of a patient from St. Louis to Omaha, NE

Current Initiatives

Electronic Patient Tracking Competitive Procurement Process

MHA Contract Deliverable

- In BP1, MHA researched current electronic patient tracking capabilities to inform an effective competitive procurement process.
- Currently, we are drafting a request for vendor proposals based on these identified capabilities.
- Following the review of initial submissions, contenders will be invited to participate in a hands-on demonstration with Missouri hospital and EMS leadership.
- Targeted implementation is second quarter 2019.

EMResource/eICS Update

EMResource

- Ongoing evaluation of resources, statuses and users to ensure a robust, reliable, redundant communication platform
 - EMS engagement
 - Re-evaluation of psychiatric resource view
- Established bridge with WebEOC to share hospital emergency department, facility and incident command status

eICS

- Completed enhancement to facilitate the transfer of incident information between systems and healthcare coalition members
- Recent educational offering to regulatory and compliance staff to promote the use of eICS for survey management
- Agreement executed to allow for the sharing of information between eICS incidents and WebEOC incidents, when mapped by a regional administrator
