## Spotlight

### Trajectories: ED Utilization – Right Care. Right Place. Right Time.

The December 2017 [issue](#) of *Trajectories* focuses on emergency department utilization. A hallmark of emergency medicine is its basis in treating acute, emergent needs with focused treatments over a relatively short timeframe, followed by transfer to the next level of care. Over the past 15 years, a significant shift in the type of care provided in an ED has been observed. EDs of today are providing increased care for patients with non-acute, chronic and psychiatric-based issues, which are typically better served through ambulatory and outpatient treatment facilities.



This issue looks at ED utilization trends and strategies to address the growing issues. Hospital EDs across Missouri have implemented many successful models to improve utilization for both patients and providers. These best practices include approaches to rural health, mental health and substance abuse, and chronic conditions and super-utilizer management.

### Site Visits

Over the next few months, HIIN Improvement Advisors will be conducting site visits with HIIN hospitals, either in-person or virtually. These visits are designed to focus on hospitals' performance in the project to-date and assist in prioritizing opportunities to net further quality improvement. To conduct a more thorough visit with robust discussions, MHA requests that hospitals schedule the HIIN/quality team and hospital leadership to attend.

### MHA Spring Bootcamps

In April, the HIIN team will continue their journey around the state to offer regional bootcamps. The four bootcamp locations include Springfield, Independence, St. Louis and Cape Girardeau. The meetings will build on MHA's larger S.A.F.E.R. Initiative to offer training to frontline staff on communication and safety techniques to improve management of escalating or violent patients and visitors. These bootcamps are open to all MHA member hospitals, and the techniques covered are designed to supplement any programs hospitals already have in place.

### 2018 HIIN Meeting

MHA's HIIN meeting will take place June 6-7 in Columbia. During the two days, attendees will learn about and participate in discussions covering the topics of UP Campaign, care transitions, antibiotic stewardship, patient safety, high reliability, patient and family engagement, physician inclusion, and clinical quality improvement. There also will be a keynote presentation on maintaining a safe environment for behavior health patients and keeping this patient population safe.

### **Emergency Preparedness Fundamentals**

MHA's Emergency Preparedness staff delivered a fundamentals course on Nov. 15. The course is an introductory overview of various emergency preparedness topics, including regulations and standards, state response structures, grant programs, and other specific emergency preparedness tools and resources available in Missouri. This offering serves as an educational opportunity for individuals with limited knowledge of emergency preparedness or who have assumed new responsibilities. There were 36 individuals in attendance representing numerous disciplines, including hospitals, local public health, emergency medical services, emergency management, long-term care and specialty clinics. Leaders or program managers looking to build depth among their teams also take advantage of this educational offering. MHA plans to host additional offerings in the future to continue to support depth and breadth within health care organizations.

### **Quality Reporting News**

#### **NHSN Release Management and Issues Webpage**

The rollout of the new NHSN Release Management and Issues webpage is intended to be used as a resource to provide a list of all known NHSN defects currently impacting the application, including those defects that might impact a facility's ability to report and/or review data in time for an upcoming CMS reporting deadline. #### **Reporting Height and Weight for Procedures**

One of the factors included in the surgical site infections standardized infection ratio calculation is the body mass index, which is calculated using the patient's height and weight. To avoid skewed data, BMI outlier values are excluded from the SSI SIR calculations. Specifically, adults with less than 12 or greater than 60 kg/m<sup>2</sup> BMI are excluded from all the 2015 Baseline SSI SIR reports. Some of these BMI data outliers are often due to potential data quality issues, which can be corrected. We have noticed a number of procedures from 2017 that contain extreme outlier of BMI data, such as procedures performed in adults with a reported BMI of less than one or greater than 500 or 2000 kg/m<sup>2</sup>.

The purpose of this message is to remind users to perform data quality checks of BMI data to confirm data is correct. If entered data are incorrect, please edit the procedure record(s) individually and save them. Then generate new analysis datasets to incorporate the updates into the analysis datasets.

**CMS Announces Deadline To Submit 3Q2017 HCAHPS Survey Data**

The submission deadline for the Hospital Consumer Assessment of Healthcare Providers and Systems patient perspectives on care survey data for third quarter 2017 discharges (July 1 – Sept. 30) is Wednesday, Jan. 3. The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services encourages all hospitals to submit data at least two days prior to the deadline to allow time to address any submission issues. Inpatient Prospective Payment System hospitals participating in the Hospital Inpatient Quality Reporting Program must collect and submit HCAHPS data in order to qualify to receive their full Annual Payment Update. Non-IPPS hospitals must meet the same submission deadline for their data to be published on Hospital Compare.

The review and correction period is Jan. 4 – 10 during which time participating hospitals have the opportunity to access and review the HCAHPS data review and correction report. New data are not accepted into the warehouse during this period, but errors in data accepted into the warehouse by the Jan. 3 deadline can be corrected and resubmitted.
